1 CLUES:

It's not a capital city, but many think it is. It's in the Southern Hemisphere. This city is famous for its opera house. Its harbour bridge is nicknamed 'The Coat hanger'.

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5 CLUES:
This city lies just south of the Equator in East Africa. It has a national park with lions and giraffes right on its outskirts. It's the capital of a country famous for long-distance runners. The Great Rift Valley runs through this country. Swahili and English are commonly spoken here.

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4 CLUES:
It's located in the north-eastern part of the United States. This city is home to Times Square and Central Park. Broadway shows and Wall Street are major features here. It's often called 'The Big Apple'. There is a famous statue of a woman in the harbour.
